The position shall be filled as soon as possible and is currently limited until 31 December 2019.

The successful candidate will be part of a larger, cross-departmental and multidisciplinary team working on migration and forced displacement. She or he is expected to contribute to innovative and methodologically demanding empirical research on causes of forced displacement and constellations of state fragility and conduct both large-n cross-country research and individual country-case field studies.

The new holder of the position will contribute to research on causes and triggers of displacement with a view to developing policy responses. Work in this field will build on previous DIE research on constellations of state fragility.

We are looking for an individual with strong research and communication skills who can independently conduct excellent empirical research and provide sound policy advice at national and international levels and who is a good team player.

Qualifications and requirements:

- Excellent academic record based on a master's degree and (preferably) a PhD in political or other related social science;
- Substantial knowledge in one or more of the following issue areas: migration and forced displacement, state fragility, international support in crisis contexts; proficiency in the analysis of political governance and multi-level governance is an asset;
- Very good command of quantitative methods and relevant software packages (especially “R”) and experience in cross-country macro-statistical analysis are mandatory;
- Research or professional experience in developing countries;
- Fluent spoken and written English, proficiency in another major international language; good German language skills are of added value;
- Willingness and aptness to travel abroad, including countries with a tropical climate (“Tropentauglichkeit”), is required.
